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## MARKER HP-21

### HENNESS PASS ROAD – BROWN'S VALLEY

"SATURDAY MORNING. STARTED ON [FROM OREGON HOUSE], AND PASSED THE TENNESSEE HOUSE ..., THEN PASSED PRAIRIE HOUSE AND CAMPT AT THE ANDROSE HOUSE AT THE FOOT OF MOUNTAIN AND TO THE LEFT OF ROAD. MADE 12 MILES." – LORING SAMUEL COMSTOCK, SEP 1, 1855

### HOW TO FIND:

From Marker HP-20, return to Marysville Road.

Turn right. Go 2.4 miles to the T intersection with the Willow Glen Road on the right.

Turn left. Go 11.3 miles south on the Marysville Road to a wide area on the right 150 yards before Hwy 20.

Turn right into the wide area and park near the white fence.

*The marker is located at the east end of a white fence and near a power pole.*

## MARKER HP-4

### HENNESS PASS ROAD – LITTLE TRUCKEE RIVER

"CAME TO A SMALL SPRING BRANCH CALLED LITTLE TRUCKEE. THIS WE FOLLOWED AND CAMPED RIGHT IN AMONG THE BEAUTIFUL PINE TREES. ... FOUND MORE GRASS THAN COULD HAVE BEEN EXPECTED IN SUCH A SHADY PLACE." – HELEN CARPENTER, SEP 23, 1857

### How To Find:

From Marker HP-3, continue 1.1 miles to a T intersection with Hwy 89.

*Old Henness Pass Road, now blocked by a locked gate on the west side of the highway, continues as a dirt road along the north side of the Little Truckee River.*

Turn right. Go 1.2 miles to the paved Henness Pass Road on the left.

Turn left. Go 50 yards and turn left again onto a paved road.

Go 1.5 miles to the Independence Lake road on the left.

Turn left. Go 0.5 mile crossing over the Little Truckee River, to the marker on the right.

*The marker is adjacent to a section of original trail which is visible on both sides of the driving road. The trail crossed the river one mile to the northeast.*
